It all begins with education.

The majority of around 1.5 million refugees in Jordan live outside of official refugee camps in inhumane conditions.

Many refugee children have no access to education, minimising their chances of building a secure future. As they flee their wartorn home countries in search of a safe place, they often find themselves isolated from educational settings.

In 2015, the charity organisation >Aynouna e.V.< was founded in order to support the improvement of educational systems for refugee children.

In March 2016, we visited Jordan for the first time. With the help of local organisation, we assessed the situation and got an overview of the children's needs. Since then, we have been collaborating with the charity >Helping Refugees in Jordan< (HJR) that was founded after the refugee crisis in Jordan in 2011. More than 150 volunteers support local organisations and institutions for refugees.

HRJ provides school supplies for children in need und supports local organisations financially as well as small projects that offer job opportunities for refugees.
